Report on Avenues' Pilot Study

Ek Kadam Aur, an NGO, based in Chicago-New Delhi, conducted an Avenues' Pilot Study at Ramakrishna Mission High School as part of its Schools Academic Enrichment program. Under this study, interdisciplinary project based methodology has been introduced to a selected set of 8th class students during a period of one and half months. 10 students and 3 teachers participated in this pilot study. On behalf of Ek Kadam Aur, Mr.Jeremy Tej Bhatia, a post-graduate student of John F.Kennedy School of Government, Harvard University, New York, USA gave initial training to the students and teachers for 10 days from 5th June 2019 to 15th June 2019. Subsequently, the pilot study went on upto 20th July 2019 under the supervision of the school teachers. During the training, the students undertook four project works. They improved their communication skills. English language skills. self-confidence. presentation techniques, self-learning through group working etc. They liberally used iPads, computers and web based learning platform of Avenues for preparing and on-line submission of assignments and project presentations.
